

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

It seems ironic that NAME has a convention scheduled for 2017, titled "Come to The Circus," the same year that Ringling Brothers Circus has announced that this is

their last year of performing. A sad day for circus lovers.


The Spirit of the Circus will continue to live on in the many museums dedicated to the Circus.

Baraboo Wisconsin, the original home of the Ringling Brothers Circus has a magnificent museum dedicated to the Circus.

In 1864, five of the seven Ringling brothers started the Circus. As the years passed Ringling adjusted their show to the changing times. The dazzling performances, the wide-eyed wonder, the music, the crowds were a staple of the circus. The circus used to be so important that schools closed and businesses let their employees off for the circus. It was like a national holiday according to Scott, curator of the Baraboo Circus Museum.

After 146 years of performances the circus is no longer relevant to the people like it once was. The phasing out of the elephants in 2016 and the changing times have made the circus obsolete.

So we will continue to preserve the circus with the Come to the Circus Convention in 2017.

Here's a new thought – "Jockeys and Juleps," the A-3 Regional Houseparty, planned for May 18-20, 2018.



# Making a Centerpiece for Alexandria: a Journey

When I heard that the NAME National Convention was going to be in my neck of the woods for the first time in many years, I was thrilled. Alexandria, Virginia is a short drive from where I live in Maryland. So when the call went out from our local club soliciting volunteers to make a centerpiece, I jumped at the chance to give back to a group that provides so much. And I thought: "There are more than two years to make the centerpiece! No problem." (A long time you might opine? Ha! You know better.)

The process started with a meeting at which we were introduced to the kit for the centerpiece, which was designed and produced by Mary and Dave Martin. As you know, centerpieces come in different scales. I work almost exclusively in 1:144—dollhouse for dollhouse—so when presented with a choice of scales I naturally choose, well, 1:48, right? No. 1:12 scale. A scale in which I've never made a roombox or scene, only a few pieces of furniture in classes. I've never made a doll. Worked with fabric. Wallpapered a room. Laid a floor. Installed lighting.

Everything in 1:12 scale is entirely different from 1:144. All my instincts were going to be wrong. I had no skills. I had no supplies. I had no knowledge. And yet this had to be something someone might actually want to take home!

Was I terrified?

Not really.

I was *petrified*.

But . . . I did have a vision of what I wanted it to be, from the moment I heard about the Convention theme and the centerpiece design. So I mused on it for 1 year and 10 months, until I had a break from work, and a deadline looming for when we had all promised to finish the centerpieces. I didn't want to be "one of those" who never finish things, so I began in earnest.

It was finally time to take all those ideas I'd been mulling over, and instructions and photos I'd downloaded from the internet, and put them into action. Now I'm not allowed to tell you what the centerpiece will be—you'll have to go to the show and see them all for yourself in person. But I can tell you a bit about what went into the project, once I worked through the terror.

I decided to make it an opportunity to learn about and try techniques and

materials about which I'd always been curious.


So first, I wondered, "How do they make those amazing finishes on grand pianos?" In the old days, I imagine they were hand applied and rubbed finishes. That shouldn't be too hard on a miniature. I bought some pumice and rotten-stone, and oil and pads and had a good time playing with an ordinary spray lacquer finish. It didn't look like any concert grand at Carnegie Hall (or any other place) but it did the trick for what I wanted: turning a typical spray-on finish into something that looked as though—at some point in the past—it had been kind of grand looking. This will carry over into 1:144 for sure.



What about some gold to go on top of the black lacquer? One of my pet peeves is that metallic finishes can be way too "bling" for scale.

I figured it might not be as obvious in 1:12 scale as in 1:144, but still likely to be an issue. Another great opportunity to experiment with different textures, color, and thickness. So out came "bare metal" (a thin layering used a lot in model car finishes), Krylon shortcuts paint in gold, a gold pen from the hardware store, and gilders paint. You know what? I found that each of these has a use, in its place.

Next, wallpaper. Jeez, what do "real" (i.e., 1:12 scale) miniaturists use? Well, the scrapbooking store (with the great name of "Queens Ink"—go to their website to see why it is called that) not too far from me was having a garage sale. For not much money, a few pads of scrapbooking paper provided a wealth of options. I now have about 200 pages of scrapbook paper and absolutely no use for them. But I did find the two pages that were exactly what I wanted.




Then, rugs. Finally, I can use up something I already have! I'm one of those (I bet you are too) who haunt upholstery shops and nab those outdated sample books they're throwing away. And I'm 62 years old, so that's a lot of nabbing.

Six hours later I had finished going through all the books I had, cutting out this piece and that and none of them seemed just right. But aha! There was some fabric in the bottom of another box in the bottom of a cabinet that will do nicely.

The terror is starting to abate as the project takes form, but there's still far to go. But now I'm on a roll (cooking with gas, as we used to say). Carving? I can do that—I took *one* class. Painting? Yeah, sure. LED lights? I know how to do that—it's a snap. Sewing? Sure, I sat through Home Ec.


Now comes the best part: shopping at Philadelphia Miniaturia for the remaining things that I need. The finish line is in sight, and it's still not close to the deadline (well not that close!).



And then the project crashes to a standstill. *Fabric*. How the heck do you get fabric to drape realistically? No idea. Never done it in 1:144.

Back to Jo-Ann's. They are happy to sell you small amounts. Surely one or two of those 6-inch widths will work out.

Back to the internet and my network of miniaturist friends who work in 1:12. Well, that network is only one person, actually, but she's great. Holly Burke, my friend of some ten years or so. The wee hours found me searching YouTube and watching videos galore. Want "do it yourself" miniature drapes? Try this method. Pins. Straws. Graph paper. Buy this product. Use Stiffy. No, use spray starch. Did I say spray starch?

I meant hairspray. More trips to the dollar store and more supplies (no one questioned why that woman was buying 11000 drink straws, bamboo skewers, and spray starch, really?).

Eventually, all the problems were solved.

All in all, despite the angst that gripped me much of the time, it was a rewarding experience. I learned a lot by testing out new products and tech-

niques; the experiments will, I'm sure, help me in the future. My local Jo-Ann's and scrapbooking store, not to mention a half-dozen sellers at Miniaturia have been supported. And I proved to myself that I really *could* do something in another scale (and also that I never wanted to do *that* again).

When I delivered my finished centerpiece to the show organizers, I was actually pretty proud of what I'd done. But I'll let you be the judge—come out to Alexandria in July and let all the centerpieces designed, executed, and crafted by dozens of diligent and creative and

talented miniaturists (and me, of course) "take YOU to the circus"!


And when the NAME National Convention comes near to your town next time . . . maybe you'll volunteer too. But be sure to allow *plenty* of lead time.





# How to Make An Electric Sander for Your Minis!




Do you ever have a problem sanding your minis, especially delicate operations like getting laser burn off tiny breakable quarter-scale pieces? Then this sander is for you. You can easily make one for yourself out of a Braun Oral B battery operated electric toothbrush (pictured at right). It **MUST** have a round head to work properly, so make sure you buy the correct version.



To make this sander, start by removing the "toothbrush" part. It just pulls off, with a little wiggling.

Then, with fine scissors, clip off as many of the bristles as you can, as close to the base as possible.



Then, sand smooth. Although I suppose you could do the sanding manually, it is far faster and simpler to do it with a belt sander.



Sand until the bristles are completely gone, and the toothbrush head is smooth.

Then, punch a piece of smooth plastic from Styrene, or other flat hard plastic (such as a plastic grocery tray) with a 5/8" round punch. Glue the plastic onto the brush head, with a good plastic glue, and clamp until dry.



Using the same punch, punch circles of sandpaper to apply to the brush head. The best sandpaper for this purpose is Diablo StickFast Sanding Disks for orbital and dual action sanders, which has a sticky back, and can be found in most hardware stores. I buy mine at Home Depot. These come in a variety of grits, including 80, 120, 180 and 220. Personally, I have prepared two sanding heads for my toothbrush, and have them finished with 80 and 220 grit. I just switch heads, depending on whether I need fine or coarse grit. Extra toothbrush heads can be purchased at any store that sells Braun electric toothbrushes.

Just punch out 5/8" circles of your chosen sandpaper, peel the backing off, and apply to your new sanding toothbrush. When the grit wears out, just peel off the worn out sandpaper and apply another piece.

Enjoy your new sander!

### Ingredients

- 3 cups water
- 2 family-size tea bags
- 1/2 to 1 cup sugar
- 7 cups cold water

### How to Make It

1. Bring 3 cups water to a boil in a saucepan; add tea bags. Boil 1 minute; remove from heat. Cover and steep 10 minutes or even longer for stronger tea.
2. Remove and discard tea bags. Add desired amount of sugar, stirring until dissolved. You have to add the sugar while it's hot!

3. Pour into a one gallon container, and add 7 cups cold water. Serve over ice.

To get this party started, the guest artist this time is Carolyn Eiche who can tell you how to make the perfect iced tea in miniature!

## WORKPROJECT

### Sweet Tea

By Carolyn Eiche, Carolyn's Creations

You will need to supply a miniature pitcher and glasses of your choice.



For ice cubes I use either the small plastic pellets they use as beanbag filler or the little cubes used as fill for flower arrangements. The straws are bristles cut from a cheap scrub brush, but make sure they are long enough to fit in your glasses and stick out of the top. The lemon slices were cut from a pre-made cane that I purchased at a show. Also, I have found nail art at my local dollar store and online both pre-cut and in canes in fruit designs that can be used for miniatures.

#### Tools needed:

- Polymer coating (*I use Envirotex Lite purchased at my local Michaels*)
- Amber Transparent Dye
- White Opaque Dye
- Paper Cup
- Stir Stick
- 1/4 Teaspoon Measuring Spoon
- Toothpicks
- Paper Towel
- Wax Paper
- Double Stick Tape
- Tacky Glue

1. Cover your work surface with a sheet of wax paper to protect from spills. Then in a paper bathroom cup mix a 1/4 teaspoon each of resin and hardener according to the package directions. Clean the spoon with a pa-

per towel between the steps. Mix well with a clean popsicle stick or coffee stirrer, etc.

2. Add some amber transparent dye, a drop at a time to the polymer in the cup. Start with one drop and mix, adding one or two more drops to deepen the color but watch it doesn't get too orange.
3. Put a drop of the white opaque on to the wax paper and dip a toothpick in to pick up some color. Swipe the toothpick through the polymer. You want to just barely tint your tea. This is to give it a slightly cloudy look, not change your color. Mix well. When happy with your tea color you're ready to pour.
4. Attach your pitcher and glasses to your work surface with a piece of double stick tape to prevent you knocking them over while filling them.
5. Use the stir stick or several clean toothpicks to carefully drip the polymer into the pitcher. Fill about half to 2/3rd of the way, then add ice cubes if desired and top with a few pieces of the lemon slices. Letting them float on top.
6. Fill each glass with a few drops of the polymer, again filling a bit over halfway. Add two to three ice cubes to each glass if desired. Push them down into the tea if you need to with a toothpick. You can also add another drop or two of polymer if needed. When satisfied, add your brush bristle straw.

7. Let everything sit undisturbed for about 24 hours to let the polymer harden. When everything is set you can cut down your straw if needed and add a slice of lemon to the side of your glass with a little tacky glue.

Sit down and enjoy your Sweet Tea in the sunshine.

## NAME Day 2017 • Going Bunkers continuing with an Armoire




No matter what scale you enjoy working in this years armoire is very easy to put together. Did you buy a kit or cut it yourself, either way it will be a great piece to add to this 2nd year of our Going Bunkers project.

All scales are put together the same basic way.

First I suggest you paint or stain all pieces and test fit before picking up that glue bottle and use a squaring jig or lego pieces to ensure your project is glued in square.

I like to finish my drawers first so they are ready to be set into place and also used to make sure your shelves are glued at the correct height.

### Drawers:



Glue the back on the outside of the bottom and glue the sides on the outside as well even with the back.

The front fits right over the side pieces to give you a great neat look to your drawer.




The long drawer is built the same with the thicker outside piece glued centre to the inner front to finish it off.



**NOTE:** I have left this front off to be able to see where the sides, shelf and centre supports goes. It is one of the last pieces I glue in place.

### Doors:

Glue the 5 pieces of the door fronts onto the outside of each of the doors. The mirror also gets its 4 pieces glued together like a frame.



### Main Unit:

You have 3 pieces the same, the bottom, top and a dividing shelf that goes on top of your long drawer.



Glue the top and bottom pieces on top of your back. Then glue the right side on.

**NOTE:** I only glue this one side on to make it easier to glue the shelves in place.

Sometimes it is easier to take a picture than to try and explain, so here is how I test fit to glue in my shelf.



The green tape is to hold your centre dividing wall and one of your small shelves in place, do NOT glue them yet. Before you glue the shelf in place slide your long drawer in to check and make sure your shelf is straight.

Slide it out and glue the end and one side of your shelf and glue it in place. Let dry well and use your finished drawers to see where to glue your small shelves in place.

Do one at a time starting with the lower one, leaving a tiny amount of space between the drawer and the shelf to make it easier to put in and out.

**NOTE:** Be sure to let each shelf dry before you put your next drawer in so you do not move any of the shelves out of place.

Now glue your other side on and when dry glue your clothes supports in and put the rod in place. You long drawer front can be glued centered onto the drawer box.

And this is what you have now. Lots of space to add hat boxes or storage on top of the drawers.

Let tackle the top, it is an easy piece to do. First glue the smaller top centered and flush at the back of the larger piece and glue that completed piece on top of your armoire again centered and flush at the back.

Legs, glue them in place front and back of your bottom. I suggest the back ones be close to the back but remember your long drawer front still needs to be glued on so your front legs can be indented just a little.

You have already put your door frames

on the outside of your doors. Now you need to cut your mylar, glue it to the frame and glue on the inside of one of your doors, centered.

This door will go on the side where your drawers are.

Now is the perfect time to add clothes and stuff inside your armoire. Use Tyvek or hinges or simply glue your doors in a partially open position. What ever you like to do with your pieces.

Look at the pictures of the finished pieces to help you complete your Armoire the way you want.

I do hope you enjoy your NAME day however you plan to celebrate it.



# Recycled Into Miniatures IV

By Dena Hamlin, Shoreline, Washington

Once again, these are ideas for mainly 1" scale –

## Greeting Cards

Would you like to make some fabulous greeting cards in miniature for practically nothing? I cut off the pictures from some of the myriad of address labels of all different styles I receive in the mail nearly every month, and glue the various pictures (from the left side of the label), vertically, to a piece of white paper, with at least a 1" margin on the left side. Then I make color copies of the pictures. I fold the left edge of the picture over the left margin I've provided and simply cut out the "card". If doable, I leave the tiniest possible white edge around each picture. I used a speck of glue to affix some of them onto the mantle of a mini fireplace. It looks like "Wish you were here" cards with light houses and beach scenes. Think of the fun you can have making Christmas and seasonal cards, flower cards, etc., from other specifically designed address labels.

## Buttons

How many times have you made or seen a cute miniature garment with "buttons" made from simple seed beads? It kinda looks like "buttons" made from simple seed beads. You can very cleverly change them in an instant to very real-looking buttons. Simply glue a tiny holeless bead in the center of each seed bead in a contrasting color. I purchased a darling baby-blue mini bathrobe with the white seed beads going down the front on a thin white ribbon. I added a tiny gold holeless bead in the center of each one and wah-lah! Instant "expensive-looking" REAL buttons.

## Book ends

While browsing around the earrings at a local thrift store, I happened upon a tiny pair in the shapes of an elephant, about 7/16" wide and not quite as tall. The backs were flat, but the fronts had a bit of dimension. If you snip off the ear wire, you can glue it to a little wooden rectangle, for instance, and make a pair of bookends. Especially if the two pieces are mirror image and face each other. Some people have made bookends by cutting off a couple of 1/2" ends

of a Popsicle stick. That works for a base to build on, but is a little obvious. Perhaps use creative painting. You can drill a little hole in your wooden shape and push a bit of the ear wire you have snipped off, right into the hole. Or you can carefully sand the back off and glue the flat side flush, right onto your chosen shape. Then glue the finished shape onto two "L-shaped" brackets and mount on either side of some books. For those who read "just a little".

Craft stores may carry mini charms and if they're small enough, you might mount them on a wee piece of wood or plastic or whatever you have on hand. Paint can make a big difference even on cardboard, to create the look of an entirely different surface. In the end, I don't care whether some treasure is made of paper, cardboard, plastic, metal, wood or clay, as long as I get the look I want.

## Craft Shapes

If you ever need to punch out any kind of a small label or design, and your paper isn't very sturdy, I suggest holding a 3" X 5" card underneath it. That way, whichever punch you decide to use, will come out cleanly and not shred or get stuck in the paper punch. If you're punching various small designs and you have used colored card stock, you can use the "extra" pieces to decorate a child's headboard or perhaps a corkboard. At craft stores I now see a lot of little "shapes" made of various materials, I assume, many to be used for scrapbooking projects. Perhaps you might try to replicate these tiny shapes and incorporate them into a miniature setting.

## Mending Broken Wooden Furniture

Has a piece of your mini wooden furniture ever broken? Like perhaps a leg snapping in two? Before I glue it back together, I'd like to share a little hint: At hardware stores you can get a set of three brown felt pens in light, medium and dark browns for scratched furniture touch up. However, I found my three at the Dollar Store. I like to color both inside edges of the two broken pieces first. Then when I glue them together, if I accidentally don't do it perfectly, no bare wood shows. Sometimes I use THE

ULTIMATE Crafter's Pick white super glue and then a wee bit of clear Super Glue with it and hold the attached piece for a few seconds until I can let go of it.

Also invest in some tiny wooden clothes pins and alligator clips from an electronics store, to hold a freshly glued piece in place, if possible. (Alligator clips are around 2" long, made to hold stereo wires. With a pliers, flatten the two little tabs that would have held the wire in place and you have a "3rd" hand!) Prop your piece up and let it dry thoroughly before you use it again and be sure to try to replace a broken leg so it is the same height as the other three legs! (Don't'cha know?) Also, you can wipe off any excess glue (with a damp twisted Q-tip) and use the appropriate color of brown and run the felt-tip pen around the glued area. It has always worked for me. Any glue soaks up the brown color and sometimes it is nearly impossible to see where the broken piece was restored!

## Ottomans

If you happen into your local thrift store, it's a good bet that you can find a couple of little velvet boxes in which a ring has safely rested. You may think I'm crazy, but I thought to myself, "Oh, look. A miniature ottoman!" If you glue four wooden beads on the bottom four corners, it really does look like a little ottoman. The only catch is that in the middle of one of the shorter sides you can see the edge of the hinge if you try real hard. You might cover it up with a cord of bunga or twisted thread around the entire box. You can even add another cord around the top edge to match or contrast with a chair.

## Glue

I don't care to use clear Super Glues to fasten "perfume bottles" or any other kind of bottle, vase or whatever, to a tray. It dries too quickly. If you accidentally pop one off or try to reposition it, there is a nasty gluey mess that is nearly impossible to clean up. And if glued to something plastic, it will NEVER come off! Plus, it gets all over your tools and fingers. I like THE ULTIMATE Crafter's Pick white super glue that dries clear. It takes longer to dry than the clear tiny tubes, but for me, it is easier to work with.

I'm also not fond of glue types that create "hairs" that stretch from your project to your fingers! Many people use Multi Grip, but you have to work fast as it sets up quickly. I don't much enjoy Multi Grip unless the pieces to be glued are larger and a small dollop will not show between two surfaces. It can gob up quickly and completely spoil an otherwise amazing project. However, I have used it to attach zillions of wooden shingles to a roof. I run a bead of the glue for the bottom and the top of the row I'm working on, in about 6" increments. Then I quickly press on the shingles. In this case, setting up quickly is definitely a good thing! But whatever glue(s) you have learned to "bond" with, I wish you the best!

### Cutting Shingles

Have you ever tried to make a diagonal cut on a wooden shingle with a scissors, only to have it crumble in your hands? Try using the Easy Cutter somewhat under \$30 at Hobby Lobby and perhaps other stores. Maybe you can order it online. It is a definite must for your toolbox if you ever plan to cut stripwood or shingles. It makes a straight, clear, clean cut of any angle and

is ready to glue in place in seconds. It surely came in handy when I cut a lot of moldings around several windows. "Snip, snip", and I'm ready to glue the next pieces.

Another tip, is that I keep a long 1" wide metal file beside my Easy Cutter. If there's a bit of "feathers" left on the bottom side, I simply swipe it over the file and they're gone. Sometimes I use a tiny scissors to snip off the feathers.

### Sharing Ideas

All the ideas I have shared in these last four articles are just to give you ideas of which you can make your own version. Such is my hope. That I have seen something someone else did and made my version of it. Then you see mine and make your version of it with what resources you have. And you may end up making a spin-off product from that. Then someone else will see your product and make their version of it, and so it goes. The joy is that you may come up with a new product or procedure that YOU can share. Remember our NAME motto: "Only through sharing can we really enjoy our treasures".

Thank you for letting me share some hopefully happy, helpful "little" hints, to make your miniaturizing experience a little more enjoyable. May I finish

with a poem I wrote about 40 years ago when I had a miniature shop for 2 1/2 years, starting in 1977, way back when our hobby first sprang up after lying dormant for so many years? Mostly women came to my shop and over time this poem blossomed into my mind. Please enjoy –

### "MOM'S DOLLHOUSE"

## • Mini Tips •

Here are some tips I learned from Loren Korff.

### Denatured Alcohol

A small amount of denatured alcohol applied to the edge of Plexiglas will help lift the protective plastic sheeting that covers the Plexiglas without scratching anything.

### Dryer Sheet

A dryer sheet can remove the dust from Plexiglas because it neutralizes the static electricity on the surface of the plexi.

### Batteries

By Luci Hanson, Grants Pass, Oregon

I work with batteries a lot. Certain batteries are prone to leak more than others. Some are prone to explode.

And 9-volt batteries have been

known to cause fires. Both the negative and positive terminals on the 9-volt are in close proximity to each other and if allowed to come in contact with metal on both terminals at the same time it will overheat the battery. Cover the end of 9-volt batteries with masking tape before storing them. Losing an item to corrosion is one thing . . . losing your home to a battery caused fire is another.

Batteries are made of stuff that is dangerous outside the wrapper. They are stored energy that can explode or leak.

Energizer claims that they never leak. Personally I won't rely on that. Duracell has had problems with leaking Alkaline batteries.

Some batteries have a long shelf life. Not all.

When an item that requires batteries is not being used it is highly advisable to remove the batteries. If you are going to store a battery operated item remove the battery before storing it. If you use

them in hearing aids or other electronic devices check them often.

There is a website that is very helpful for understanding batteries and their handling an use.....www.batteryuniversity.com If you use batteries . . . you owe it to yourself to be informed.

### Dust Free

the same room with multiple microwave ovens, refrigerators and sinks.


- Hot coffee, water, snacks, fruits, pastries are offered.






