Friday Workshops

F1 – Framed Garden View Room Box by Karen Benson

Build a removable Room Box with beautiful tranquil garden view beyond the French doors. The room box sits in an exterior box on the back side of the front frame. Limited only by your imagination - will this be a bedroom, sitting room, den, library??? You decide. The area to be furnished in the room box is 4-1/4" W x 2-3/4" D. This box is lit by 3 Mega LED lights so you will learn to wire the lights to a AAA battery packs that is concealed above the ceiling in an easy access design. One of the lights is on the garden side of the room box. Frame is 6" W x 3-3/4"H x 3-1/4" D. 1/4" scale

F2 – Nature's Neighbors by Sally Manwell

You will make the wild iris out of another laser cut flower with trimming. Wind the stems of the morning glory around the hand pump that you have weathered, then make tendrils, leaves and the morning glory flowers. Then add some grasses and plants that can be purchased from train stores. You will weather the tub and fill it with a UV resin. Add some butterflies and birds and animals from Barbara Ann Meyer to finish the neighborhood scene. 1" x 1" x 2" 1/4" scale

FS1 –Elegant Country Manor by Linda Farris

A Wee Forest Family have gone out looking for a new home when they stumble across an old orange juice bottle that some Big Folk have thrown away. Wanting a two-story home for their expanding family, they decide this will do perfectly. First, they have to texture and paint the outside and inside to cover all the stains. Liking lots of light, they decide to make some bay windows to add to the sides. Then they whitewash some old clapboard to use as flooring and outside trim. They have lovely satin geometric fabric for the upper level floor. Knowing that sliding barn doors are all the rage they now make some of the back of their new home, which leads to a beautiful log round patio. Landscaping is their thing, so they make use of the big fold plants and flowers for their yard and drag in some sea glass pieces to create a walkway. Adding some whimsical floral trim to the outside of their manor turns out to be just the thing. As a final touch they add battery operated lights in the attic to shine down into the rooms. They already have some lawn chairs and one of the Wee Family's adorable little girls is staying to help decorate the Elegant Country Manor. 9-1/2" W x 7-1/2" D x 11" H

FS2 – Night Lights Out of My Window by Yvonne Ayoroa

The room that you build can be either a bedroom or a living room or what every room you want. There is a large "glass" window/door that looks out over the city skyline at night. The scene outside the window is a night time city. There is a fireplace in the room with a "working" fire. The room is decorated in an Art Deco style. Minimum Skill Level: Beginner 1/2" scale

FS3 – Pennsylvania Drawing Room: A Tribute to the Thorne Rooms by Gayle Baillargeon Class Fee: \$139 Based on a 18th Century Pennsylvania Drawing Room, this ¹⁄₄" scale tribute to the Thorne Rooms, includes all furniture, accessories and the atmospheric lighting that is such an integral part the original Thorne room. Students will construct the paneled walls, built in cabinetry, relief carved decorated ceiling, and wood floors, assemble the front frame and install LED battery powered lighting. Kits for furniture, the chandelier and all accessories will be supplied and assembled if time allows. For safety reasons the glass in the front will not be included in the kit. Students are asked to bring a 4" x 6" piece of glass to be used in the front. Glass from a dollar store picture frame is perfect. 5" H x 7" W x 5" D Minimum Skill Level: Intermediate 1/4" scale

FS4 – A Victorian Cottage by Kristie Norman

The Victorian cottage is 4-7/8" L x 3-3/8" W x 4" H. The base for the house is 6-5/8" L x 4-5/8" W x ³/4" H. The house and porch are laser cut from 3/32" basswood and the shingles are laser cut from 1/64" Cherry veneer. The windows and outside trim are laser cut from 1/16" basswood. The inside window trim and baseboard are also cut from 1/64" Cherry veneer. The kit includes, wallpaper, flooring, curtains, rugs, lamp, LED light, battery case and landscaping materials. The furniture for the house in not included, however, students can purchase the laser cut furniture kits from my website. 6-5/8" x 4-5/8" x 3/4" Minimum Skill Level: Beginner 1/4" scale

S1 – Bubba's Gas and Oil by Cat Wingler

Growing up in my neighborhood you could find these small family owned gas stations all over and you can still find them on back roads all over the rural south. The little gas station is a reminder of days gone by, when every boy was his own mechanic and gas was cheap. We've closed the men's room door, but you have the option of leaving it slightly open to peek at the grungy inside. Grab an RC cola and a Moon Pie and join Cat in remaking this fond memory. 5" x 7" x 3" Minimum Skill Level: All Skill Levels 1/4" scale

S2 – Back Yard Deck by Cindy McDaniel

Everything is included in the picture but you will have a variety of people, flowers, and seat cushion material to select from. This will make your workshop your own. You will assemble the planters and benches. You will only need your basic tool kit and paint. This piece will stand alone by itself or by removing one of the railings you can but it up against your house. The footprint will fit in an enclosed case to keep it clean. 5-1/4" x 7-1/4" x 5-1/2" 1/4" scale

Minimum Skill Level: Beginner

S3 – Make and Upholster a ¼" Scale Chair by Sally Manwell

Invite the neighbors in for a chat and see your new chair. You will make a 1/4" scale chair out of card stock, foam core and wood. Next upholster it in your choice of fabric. Sally will bring several to choose from or bring your own. If you bring your own, it needs to be a lightweight cotton, no polyester. An overall pattern is easier to work with than strips or plaids that need to be matched. Think about where you will put your chair - living room, sitting room, she shed, man cave or attic. That will help determine how you will upholster it. If there is time, you will make a matching ottoman. You will be able to make more chairs with the pattern you receive. $\frac{1}{2}$ x $\frac{1}{2}$ x 1"
