Room Box Ideas

What would you do with a room box? What is a room box? A room box is just that - A BOX! It can be any box. Wood, cardboard, gift box, gift bag. The Eugene Miniatures Club has started a long term project where they challenge their members to build from scratch a box to get new enthusiasts involved learning new skills and techniques. They are starting out with bare wood that has been cut to 1" scale with a foot print of 14" wide, 10" deep and 10" tall. Skills that will be learned are flooring. How to cut in windows or doors. Electrical. How to finish inside and outside walls. And if desired how to add depth by installing a false wall with a scene.
