TLS2 – Antiques in Miniature: Creating New Heirlooms by Bradley Meinke

An informative and interactive lecture by IGMA Artisan Bradley L. Meinke. Meinke is known for his aged and worn historically inspired furniture and accessories. Bradley will share his research and inspiration process along with workbench tips. TLS3 – Costume Accessories from Victorian Times to Today by Rachelle Speigel

Come with me on a journey through the ins and outs of the costume accessory. Stockings, shoes, hats, scarves, and gloves first served to protect the wearer from the elements. Fans, parasols, and umbrellas protected from the weather. Bags and purses held valuable items close to the body. Pins and broches held clothing together and soon became articles of adornment as jewelry. Over time accessories became social, economic, and political symbols and were changed and embellished. By the Victorian era costume accessories had become an integral part of fashion and styles evolved rapidly with advances in manufacturing and changing tastes and values. We will dart through the centuries, looking at trends that came and went with some examples in miniature and photos. Your gift will be a choice of 1" scale Victorian accessories, or accessories from the 1920's.

TLS4 – Wrought Iron Styles – Elegance for any Little House by Sherry Taylor

Wrought iron has an unending appeal in many different décor styles. Meet me for the luncheon as I explain how I started in miniatures and the challenge of creating pieces that look like wrought iron, but do so without metal. Learn where I get some of my inspiration or suggest an item you have seen that would be a great reproduction.
