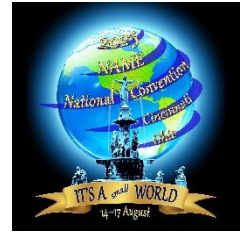

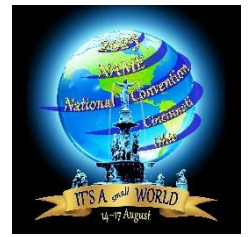
TLF4 – Fashion of the Victorian Era
